This year marks the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis' creation of the first live nativity scene, an ancestor of the porcelain and olive wood and paper cut-out sets that appear in our houses at this time of the year. According to his biographer, Francis was so moved by a visit he made to Bethlehem that he later recreated the scene of Jesus' birth – made it real for himself and those around him.
