

PSB: Praying Shapes Believing

Whether it is your first time, or your thousandth, reading, reciting, and praying the traditional Rite II worship, it is worthwhile to ask why. In this section of the leaflet, we will examine some of our prayers and collects to help us find more meaning and connection in the ritual.

The Song of Praise

The Gloria in Excelsis usually, except in Lent and Advent, when the Kyrie Eleison or the Trisagion is used. Other songs or hymns might be used.

What is it?

This hymn probably started in Latin/Western churches (our ancestors) as a way of helping the people to join in the beginning of worship. Before many popular hymns existed, the chants used in the prayer services of the church – the Gloria was one such – were the religious songs they knew best.

Why do we do it?

By including a sung prayer of praise to God near the beginning of our worship, we call to mind God's blessings to us, including the blessing of being a community that can worship together.

What it says about God

God is worthy to be praised by us, as much as by angels. Jesus is both our judge and our advocate at the throne of God. God is unique in holiness, different from all the rest of the created order.

Messages for how we live


Gratitude to God is the foundation of the Christian life. Praise is as important a component of our prayer life as is petition. Thankfulness is the key to generosity.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

For all who serve in the armed forces and all who go in harm's way to protect others, especially those we name now, aloud or in our hearts, we pray to the Lord. Lord, show us your light.

For those who have died, especially those we name now, aloud or in our hearts, that they may have light and peace, and rest with all the saints, we pray to the Lord. Lord, show us your light.

With saint and angels, we proclaim:

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death with death, and bringing life to those who dwell in tombs. Amen.




