First Lesson

Genesis 15:1-12,17-18

And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.






