A LITANY IN THE WORDS OF MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

Deacon: Let us, before all else, give thanks for the love of God revealed to the world in the life and death of Jesus Christ:

Leader: "The Cross is the eternal expression of the length to which God will go in order to restore a broken community"

Deacon: Let us give thanks for the legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, jr. and for the enduring power of his dream:

Leader: "I have a dream that one day 'every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low...and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together'...With this faith, we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will all be free one day."

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to pray and work for peace:

Leader: "One day we must come to see that peace is not merely a distant goal that we seek, but a means by which we arrive at the goal....How much longer must we play at deadly war games before we heed the plaintive please of the unnumbered dead and maimed of past wars?"

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to walk in the way of nonviolence:

Leader: "The non-violent approach...first does something to the hearts and souls of the committed to it. It gives them new self-respect; it calls up resources of strength and courage that they did not know they had. Finally, it reaches the opponent and so stirs his conscience that reconciliation becomes reality."

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to pray and work for a just ordering of the world:

Leader: "Every step toward the goal of justice requires sacrifice, suffering and struggle;

the tireless exertions and passionate concern of dedicated individuals...This is

not time for apath or complacency. This is the time for vigorous and positive

action."

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to the vision of a world without poverty and disease: Leader: "I have the audacity to believe that peoples everywhere can have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality, and freedom for the spirits."

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to seek the spiritual renewal of our nation:

Leader: "A nation that continues year after year to spend more money on military

defense than on programs of social uplift is approaching spiritual death."

Deacon: Let us commit ourselves to seek the spiritual renewal of the church:

Leader: "In spite of being disappointed, in spite of being left out without any initial response, millions of people are still knocking on the door of the Church and turning to it for the answers to the basic problems of life. The great challenge facing the Church today is to keep the bread fresh."

All: "And now unto God who is able to keep us from falling and lift us from the dark valley of despair to the mountains of home, from the midnight of desperation to the daybreak of joy, to God be power and authority, for ever and ever." Amen.

THE LESSONS seated

First Lesson 1 Samuel 3:1-20

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."

Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." So

Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him."


