Holy Eucharist 12:00 Noon Solemn Evensong 7:00 PM

Our usual Wednesday midday Eucharist with intercessory prayer. In the evening, a chanted service of evening prayer.

## Maundy Thursday, March 28th

Holy Eucharist with stripping of the altar, and watch 7:00 PM

This evening we celebrate the Eucharist, remove the ornaments in the church in preparation for Good Friday, and reserve the Blessed Sacrament on the Altar of Repose. The church will be open continuously (live and by YouTube) until 9:00 Friday morning for those who wish to follow Our Lord's request that we watch with Him "one brief hour" (Matthew 26:40).

Good Friday Liturgy 12:00 Noon at St Nicholas, Newark Stations of the Cross 7:00 PM

The principal Good Friday Liturgy will be observed at noon, with the solemn collects and Eucharist from the Reserved Sacrament. The evening service will be the traditional Christian cycle of prayers on the Way of the Cross.

## Sunday of the Resurrection, March 31st

Holy Eucharist 6:00, 8:00, & 10:30

New this year is a 6:00 AM sunrise service to be held in the Grove (weather permitting). In a nod to the Easter Vigil, it will take place around a fire pit (the New Fire). To help connect us with the experience of the followers of Jesus on that first Easter, it will be simple, even a little raw, in its mix of surprise and wonder and joy. For those who prefer a more traditional Easter celebration, the 8:00 and 10:30 services will have all the trimmings!






First Lesson Jeremiah 31:31-34

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son,

today I have begotten you";

as he says also in another place,

"You are a priest forever,

according to the order of Melchizedek."

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

THE NICENE CREED standing


